GARDENING TRAINING

Offered on request to groups of 5 or more people. Here are the themes:

- Two new courses in 2018: The Culture of Herbs and Native Plants in Quebec
- Protecting Plants Against Pests (insects, squirrels), Diseases and Weeds
- Finding Out More About Leguminous Plants (e.g. beans and peas)
- Urban Agriculture 101

- Indoor Plants (Needs and Maintenance)
- What to do with Harvests (different uses)





GARDENING MATERIALS

Orders must be placed before MAY 18. QUANTITIES ARE LIMITED.

FOR "BALCONY" MEMBERS:

- Small wood planters (34" x 12" x 16") with soil, for balconies
 There will be a draw for the planters. The draw will take place during the week of May 21. The winners will be notified by phone. In order to give everyone a chance to get a small planter, only "balcony" members who have never received a planter may request one.
- Each member is entitled to a maximum number of plants.
 This number is calculated using a point system, with a maximum of 15 points. See table:



TYPES OF PLANTS	FORMAT	POINTS
Vegetables/herbs	4-inch pot	5
	Seed starters	5

FOR "LAND" MEMBERS:

Members wishing to set up a garden on the grounds of their housing project must inform their tenant committee or community organizer about their landscaping project.

- Up to 25 bags per building (compost, topsoil, mulch)
- Large wood collective planters (48" x 30"x 30")
- Plants: each building is entitled to a maximum number of plants (the types of plants will depend on availability). This quantity is calculated in points, for a maximum of 100 points.
 See table and example:

TYPES OF PLANTS	FORMAT	POINTS
Deciduous shrubs	Large Small	20 8
Perennials	Pot	12
Grasses	Pot	12
Vegetables/herbs	Pot or seed starters	5

For example, a building orders

	s 100 points
2 grasses, 12 points x 2 =	24 points
3 perennials, 12 points x 3 =	36 points
2 large shrubs, 20 points x 2 =	40 points
