Three keywords for YOUR SAFETY



LOCK

Always lock your apartment door, even if you will be absent for just a few minutes.

IDENTIFY

Always ask people to identify themselves by intercom before opening the door.

CLOSE

When you enter or leave the building, be sure to close the door behind you and not allow access to stangers.
