Sector committees: a major change

In late 2019, OMHM management asked the joint committee on tenant participation forums to propose modifications to the sector committees.

The objectives were to:

- group associations into smaller sectors;
- have more time for exchanges between associations;
- identify common issues within associations;
- · discuss real sector issues with management;
- develop tangible projects with a participatory budget.



The proposed modification was unanimously accepted by tenants and the OMHM. The sector committees now have a new territorial breakdown and a new way of operating.

Key points include:

- **Seven** (7) sector committees.
- Four (4) meetings per year. The first meeting will take place in October with representatives from both OMHM and tenants.
- One (1) responsible manager and one (1) community organizer per sector.
- Administrative support is managed by the tenants or by the Tenant Resource Group and community organizers.
- Use of a simple action tracker to resolve issues.




