2019 Elections Who will you vote for?



The election date for tenant members of three of the OMHM's participatory bodies is fast approaching. On April 23, the voting delegates will meet to elect the people who will speak on behalf of all OMHM tenants. There are two vacancies on the Board of Directors, three on the Selection Committee (including one alternate position) and two on the Committee on Housing Transfers due to Biopsychosocial Reasons (including one alternate position).

I am writing to you today as Board Chair, a role I took on in September 2018. I have been on the Board of Directors since April 2016, which means I have worked with tenant members of the Board for the past three years already. I can vouch for

the major difference they make to the management of our organization. We really value having a tenant member for families and people living alone, and a tenant member for seniors. Their presence helps administrators better understand the realities experienced daily by our residents in low-rent housing, affordable housing and ENHARMONIE residences. On one hand, these members make an essential contribution to the work of the Board by highlighting the concerns and needs of all OMHM tenants. On the other hand, just like all other Board members, they are involved in decision-making regarding the Office's priorities, means and interests. This is their double responsibility, which they take on with heart and dedication. The tenant members of the other two committees also contribute to the decisions of their respective committee, in order to respect the needs of all tenants.

It is therefore important for you, as a member of a tenant association or of the ENHARMONIE Advisory Committee of Tenants, to ensure that delegates are chosen to represent your association in the elections on April 23. You have until April 8 to inform us of the names of your delegates.

In the following pages, we will introduce the candidates for the three participatory bodies. I invite all delegates to attend on voting day.

The big day is approaching!

Every three years, the two advisory committees of tenants (CCR HLM and CCR ENHARMONIE) are responsible for organizing elections. In so doing, they ensure that tenants of the Office municipal d'habitation de Montréal (OMHM) are properly represented on the bodies governing this organization.

Tenant associations and members of the CCR ENHARMONIE must submit to the OMHM the names of the delegates with voting rights by April 8, 2019. It is vital for all delegates to be present on voting day at the Sainte-Catherine d'Alexandrie Community Centre so that the elections are reflective of what you want to see happen!

How the elections are held

The CCR ENHARMONIE and the delegates for low-rent housing tenants will attend an election meeting on April 23 to elect the tenant representatives, in accordance with the procedures established by the two advisory committees of tenants.
