News on tenant action in Montreal's low-rent housing

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Tenants elect their representative on the OMHM Board



On July 12, 23 tenant association and CCR ENHARMONIE delegates met at the Administration and Services Centre of the Office municipal d'habitation de Montréal (OMHM) in Rosemont to hear from the three candidates seeking to fill the vacant position on the Board of Directors. Ms. Silvia Rocha of Habitations Sainte-Brigide was elected. Her experience as chair of her tenant association and involvement on sector committees will serve her well in representing tenants on the Board of Directors. As an elected member, she will also sit on the Comité consultatif des résidants (CCR or Advisory Committee of Tenants) for low-rent housing and the ENHARMONIE residences.

Robert Pilon, coordinator of the Fédération des locataires d'habitation à loyer modique du Québec (FLHLMQ) and meeting chair, invited Suzanne Payant to speak first. Elected in 2022 as a Board of Directors' tenant member from housing for families, she gave an overview of the role of tenants in this participatory body and the scope of work that they could expect. "We represent tenants, but we also represent the OMHM. It's a great team," she said.

Mr. Pilon reminded the tenant association delegates and the members of the CCR ENHARMONIE that they were there to choose the person who would succeed Ahmed Drissi. Mr. Drissi was elected in April 2023 to replace Raymond Saulnier as a member from housing for seniors. He was to complete Mr. Saulnier's mandate over the next 2 years but resigned shortly after taking the role meaning a new election was necessary.

All three candidates put their case forward with aplomb. Résidence Piero-Corti resident Nicole Aubé spoke first, followed by Estelle Laliberté of Résidence Lionel-Bourdon, and Ms. Rocha. "It's great to see three candidates, three experienced women, making this a true democratic exercise," said Mr. Pilon. The three candidates all shared great qualities, most notably their commitment, empathy, and willingness to help others.

Fire prevention

The Service de sécurité incendie de Montréal (SIM) Fire Prevention Week was held from October 8 to 14 under the theme "Le premier responsable, c'est toi!" (The first person in charge is you!). The Office municipal d'habitation de Montréal (OMHM) took the opportunity to remind all residents of the importance of preventive measures.

One of these measures—evacuation drills—should be taken very seriously. They are essential for keeping everyone in the building safe. Taking part in these exercises

teaches residents what to do in the event of a fire and allows OMHM staff to verify that all safety equipment is working properly. When practising these drills, you develop good reflexes in an emergency, which could save lives.

It is vital for all occupants to understand that they must **exit the building** when the alarm sounds and go **to the established meeting point**. All tenants in high-rise buildings have received a letter indicating the meeting point location outside their building.

A new tenant awareness campaign has just been launched. On buildings' screens, you will see messages encouraging tenants to purchase home insurance. It is important to remind tenants that they are

responsible for protecting everything inside their apartment. Information sheets will be provided upon signing the lease and are available at Service Desks East and West.
